Dorcas is a Christian organisation working in Eastern Europe, the Middle East and Africa. We have worked in Ukraine since 1998. Dorcas supports people facing poverty, exclusion and crisis. We stand beside people in vulnerable situations. We support them to unlock their potential and restore their dignity. We work with partners to strengthen resilience, expand access to services and promote social inclusion. Our mission is rooted in compassion and action. We follow Jesus' example by standing with those who are left behind.

## Dorcas Ukraine at a glance

### Who we are

Dorcas Ukraine works across eastern and western Ukraine, supporting communities affected by conflict, displacement and long-term economic strain. We operate from offices in Transcarpathia and Zaporizhzhia enabling flexible responses in volatile contexts. Our work has evolved from humanitarian assistance to integrated recovery programming that strengthens community safety nets, supports psychosocial well-being, and enables locally led development. We collaborate with grassroots organisations, churches, local authorities and international partners. Our long-term presence and trusted relationships allow us to support communities as they transition from crisis to recovery, ensuring that people in vulnerable situations can rebuild their lives with dignity and resilience.

### Our expertise

We work across four themes: Crisis Response, Protection, Economic Development, and Community Development. Our programmes combine humanitarian assistance with long-term recovery approaches. We apply community-led methodologies, strengthen local safety nets, and support inclusive economic participation. Our MEAL systems are being standardised to align

with Dorcas quality standards, ensuring evidence-based decision-making and continuous programme improvement. All positions are filled locally, strengthening national leadership and contextual expertise.

### Our geographic focus and reach

West: Transcarpathia

East: Zaporizhzhia.

National hubs: Kyiv.

Potential expansion:

Areas within 250 km east of Zaporizhzhia.



### Regional priorities

#### Transcarpathia:

Strengthen community safety nets and inclusive recovery.

**Zaporizhzhia:** Support conflict-affected populations with integrated recovery assistance.

**Kyiv:** Serve as a strategic hub for coordination, partnerships and national influence.

## Current reach





### Our strategic ambition

Dorcas Ukraine aims to grow its reach, enhance programme quality and strengthen its position as a leading community-based recovery and resilience actor. We will diversify funding from two to four sources, expand local partnerships, and integrate humanitarian assistance with long-term recovery programming.

# Dorcas vision for Ukraine

*By 2030, we envision a Ukraine where:*

Communities in both eastern and western regions lead their own recovery and build long-term resilience.

People in vulnerable situations – including older persons, displaced families and marginalised children – thrive with dignity and social inclusion.

Local systems and community safety nets are strengthened to provide sustainable support beyond the humanitarian phase.

### How Dorcas contributes to this vision

Dorcas Ukraine bridges humanitarian assistance with community-driven recovery. Our programmes strengthen community safety nets, support psychosocial well-being, and enable inclusive economic participation. We work with grassroots organisations, churches and local authorities to build sustainable local capacity. Our approach integrates crisis response, protection, economic development and community development, ensuring that interventions address both immediate needs and long-term resilience. By 2030, we will expand our partner network, diversify funding, and strengthen national staff leadership. Through evidence-based programming, community facilitation and strategic partnerships, we support communities transition from crisis to recovery and build a foundation for lasting transformation.

### The challenges we address with our partners

#### Economic strain and chronic poverty

Inflation, rising utility costs and disrupted livelihoods undermine recovery and deepen vulnerability.

#### Ongoing conflict and infrastructure destruction

Missile attacks, damaged homes and disrupted services create persistent humanitarian needs.

#### Social exclusion and weakened community ties

Older persons, displaced families and marginalised children face isolation, instability and limited access to services.

**Over 6 million people** remain internally displaced in Ukraine, requiring sustained support for recovery and reintegration.

# How Dorcas makes a difference in Ukraine

Dorcas Ukraine works through four programmatic themes that advance our 2030 vision. We ensure that interventions address both immediate needs and long-term resilience.



## Crisis Response

**What we do** We provide life-saving assistance and support communities recovering from conflict-related damage.

**Impact example** In the Zaporizhzhia region, homes are frequently damaged by missile and drone attacks. Dorcas Ukraine repairs doors, windows and roofs, ensuring families can remain safe, warm and protected.

**Contribution to vision** Strengthens safety, stability and the foundations for long-term recovery.

**Key metric** 271 households receive emergency shelter repairs and support each year to get through the winter.



## Economic Development

**What we do** We support people gain job skills, start small businesses and access inclusive markets.

**Impact example** The conflict has caused widespread job loss. Dorcas Ukraine provides grants for people to learn new skills aligned with local labour market needs, enabling them to secure income and rebuild livelihoods.

**Contribution to vision** Supports economic resilience and reduces long-term vulnerability.

**Key metric** 1,072 people received grants to learn new skills.





## Protection

**What we do** We protect people vulnerable to poverty, exclusion and crisis through integrated support and prevention.

**Impact example** Older persons face isolation and hardship. Dorcas Ukraine provides weekly home visits, pastoral care and practical support to ensure their well-being and dignity.

**Contribution to vision** Promotes safety, inclusion and psychosocial well-being.

**Key metric** 2,185 individuals in vulnerable situations receive regular protection and psychosocial support services.



## Community Development

**What we do** We strengthen community structures and safety nets through collaborative, locally led approaches.

**Impact example** Dorcas Ukraine partners with local church organisations to support vulnerable situations and develop income-generating activities that sustain community initiatives in the long term.

**Contribution to vision** Builds resilient, inclusive communities capable of leading their own recovery.

**Key metric** 59 community groups strengthened and actively implementing locally led initiatives annually.



## National Folk Artist inspires others to live

# A renewed desire to live

Lyudmila Ihorivna, a National Folk Artist of Ukraine from Zaporizhzhia, devoted 45 years to teaching art. After losing her husband and seeing her son Yurii suffer a stroke, her own health declined. A heart condition and breathing difficulties made it hard for her to leave her home.

“My whole life, I took children to exhibitions and competitions. But when hardships and health problems forced me to stop, I felt completely discouraged,” she says.

Through Dorcas’s home-based care programme for people with reduced mobility, Lyudmila attended doctors’ lectures that helped her change daily habits and understand stroke recovery.

Inspired by her story, the Dorcas team invited her to lead art therapy workshops for volunteers who visit older person with reduced mobility. “I am very happy to be part of this project, because by returning to activities and art therapy, I feel a renewed desire to live and create!” exclaims Lyudmila.

## Our contribution to Ukraine's development (2020–2025)

Dorcas Ukraine supported communities across eastern and western regions through humanitarian assistance, community safety nets, psychosocial support and recovery initiatives. We strengthened local partnerships, expanded community-led programming and laid the foundation for integrated recovery approaches.

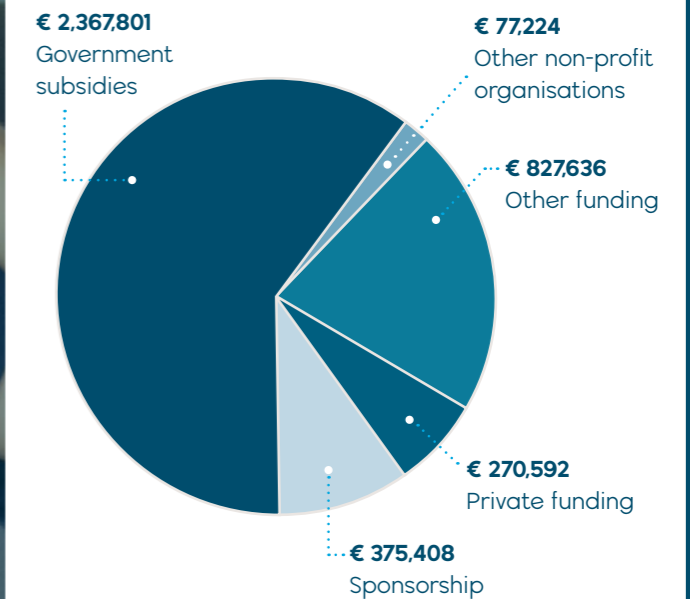
**Independent external evaluations** and post-distribution monitoring consistently demonstrate strong programme effectiveness. Project participant satisfaction rates are high and measurable improvements in household resilience and self-reliance occur six months after support was received. These results affirm the sustainability of our community-based approach and inform continuous programme improvement.
